<u>Purpose</u>: The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding is to expand the opportunities for individuals in the Oklahoma City metropolitan area to prepare themselves for a career in law enforcement.

Primary Institution: Students shall have the option of pursuing the COP associate's degree at either RSC or OSU-OKC. The institution that accepts a student into its COP shall be the primary institution for that student. The policies and procedures in effect at the student's primary institution shall govern that student in areas such as admission to the COP, overall academic guidance and counseling, financial aid, residency requirements, minimum retention grade point average requirements, etc.

Courses: Students may take courses at OSU-OKC and/or at RSC as part of their COP degree requirements if those courses are accepted by their primary institution as fulfilling its COP curriculum requirements. However, COP "skills" courses (listed below) must be taken from OSU-OKC. The following courses are designated as COP "skills" courses: PLSC 1211/Firearms, PLSC 1212/Traffic, PLSC 1313/Patrol Procedures, PLSC 2111/Defense Tactics, and PLSC 2211/Emergency Vehicle Operations.

Liaison: The directors of the COP at RSC and at OSU-OKC shall be responsible for communication within and between those institutions regarding students, curriculum matters, scheduling, and other concerns related to the COP.

Council on Law Enforcement Education & Training (CLEET) Objectives: Although course prefixes, titles and credit hours may vary, both OSU-OKC and RSC will ensure that all required CLEET course objectives are imbedded in their curriculum requirements for the Collegiate Officer Program.
